LAMDA Graded Examinations in Performance: Acting

These exams are designed to develop the skills necessary to communicate dramatic text to an audience. Students will develop interpretative skills, technical skills and knowledge of the performance process. They will be required to perform scenes from memory, audibly and clearly, understand the meaning of what they are speaking and be able to move appropriately. These exams help to improve speech and performance skills as well as build confidence and social skills. Monologues as well as duologues can be performed depending on grade. How Much Does It Cost?

The classes run term time and cost £130.00 for 10 weeks, payable termly in advance. The group is small, with two tutors, and lasts for 45 minutes. Exams are held annually in London (usually in the Summer Term) and fees start from £27.00 depending on the level. However, exams don't have to be taken, so we offer an end of year presentation for parents to watch, so students get the same performance experience.
